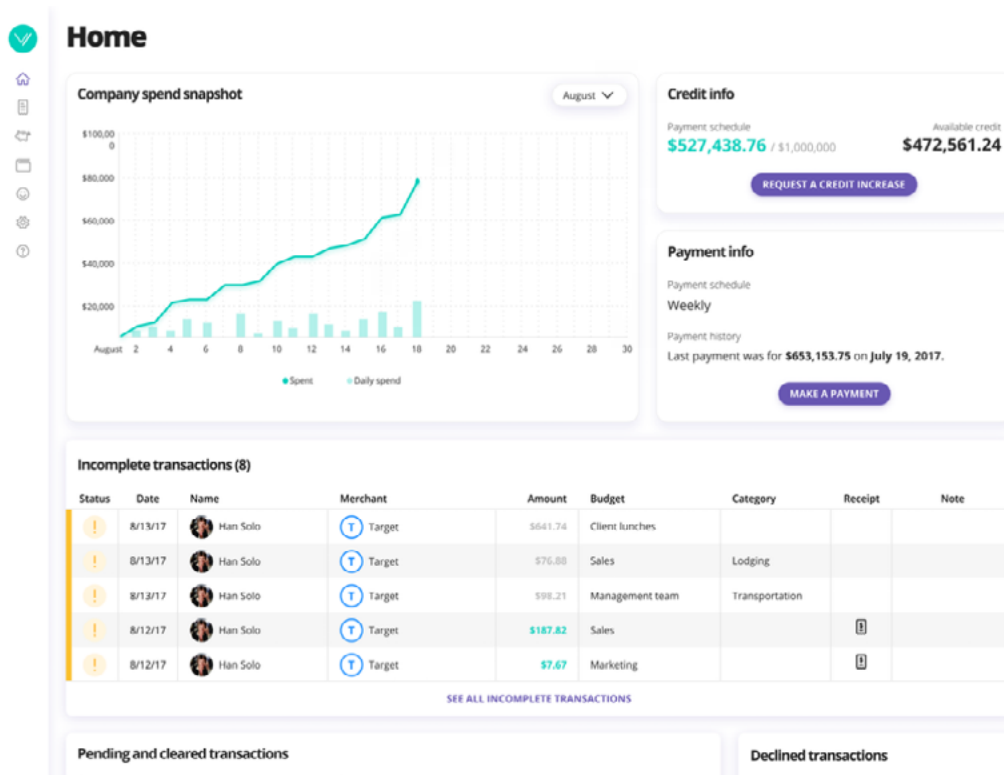

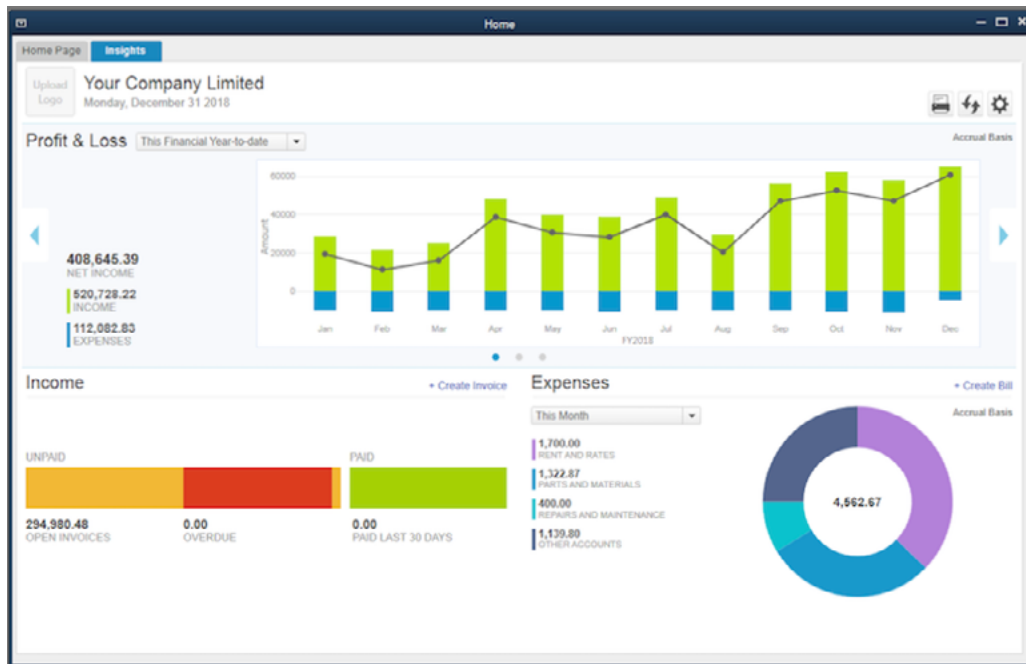
1. Divvy

Divvy also offers a free mobile app, which can be used to take photos of receipts and other expense-related information.

Divvy's built-in dashboards track spending down to the employee level, which allows for a more detailed and efficient expense approval process. And because transactions are linked through a company-issued credit card, the dashboards provide live visibility into your organizational spend and budget, visualized through a variety of customizable reporting templates.

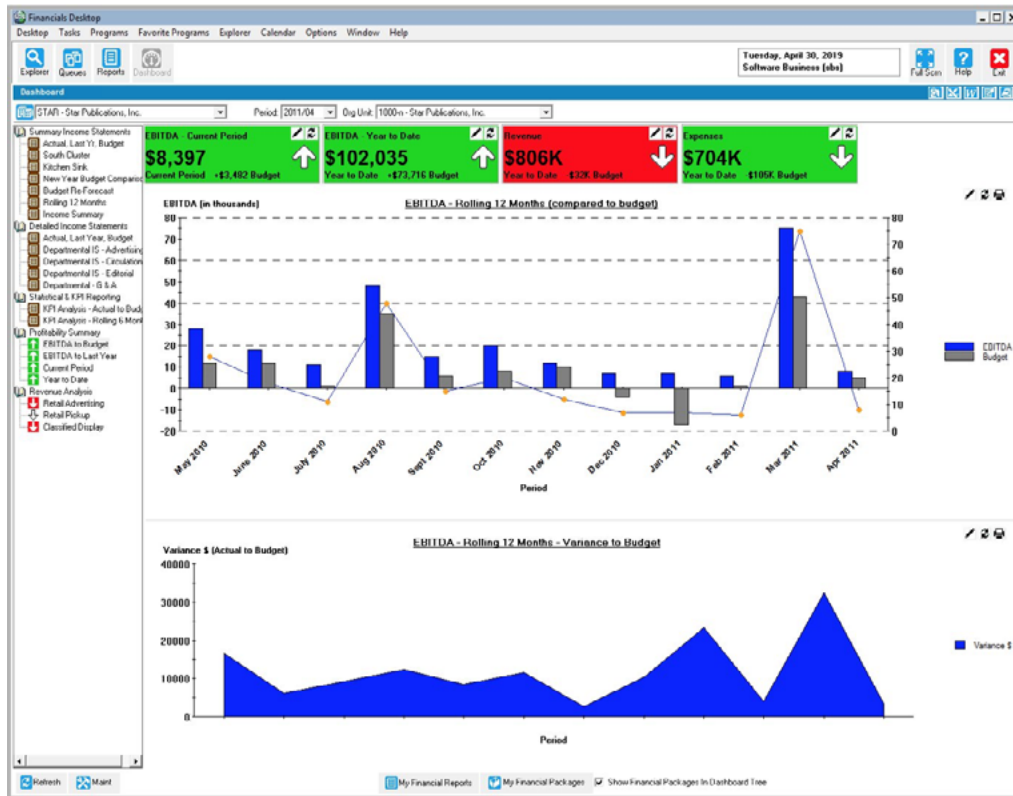
2. QuickBooks Premier
